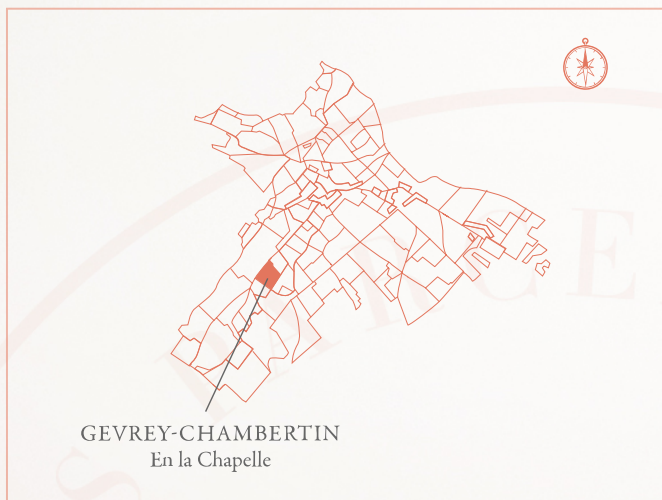
VOLUPTUOUS AND COMPLEX

THIS "CLIMAT"

The origin of the name of this vineyard comes from the Notre Dame de Bèze Chapel which was built there in 1155 by the Monks of the Bèze Abbey.

TERROIR

Located mid-slope facing east, south of Gevrey-Chambertin, this terroir consists of limestone scree soil covered with a thin layer of clay on the surface.



TASTING

Apperance : Bright color, dark ruby

Bouquet : Nose of black cherry, raspberry, blackcurrant and redcurrant with spicy notes.

In the mouth : Power, opulence and elegance compose a whole and complex body with small red and black fruits and create a suave and voluptuous wine.
